Dear Friends.

During the past 18 months, your compassion and generosity helped Second Chances and the folks we serve face a year none of us ever imagined. You supported us as we navigated uncharted territory - adapting, pivoting, and persevering again and again. You showed us the true meaning and spirit of community, while you simultaneously faced challenges at home, work, school, and in the aisles of the grocery store. I've been so deeply inspired by your kindness and encouragement - it is, quite honestly, what's kept me going. I hope that our fall 2021 Community Report will inspire you with its heartening stories and news of our collective positive impact.

Since 2005, Second Chances has been part of the safety net for community members who are navigating setbacks. And, because of you, we were able to be a resource for folks during one of the most difficult periods many have faced. With isolation, job loss, housing instability, and increased risk of serious illness, our clients have experienced an extremely challenging time – one that is likely to continue into 2022 and possibly beyond.

You made it possible for Second Chances to provide no-cost, empowering clothing, shoes, accessories, and gift cards to a record number of men, women, and children in need this year. When protecting vulnerable community members had to be our priority, delivering a warm winter hat or new pair of socks was a way we could show people how much our community cares about their wellbeing. Generous friends like you made it possible to fulfill 100% of requests for clothing this year.

Our nonprofit partners and Second Chances have responded enthusiastically to the reopening of our community, delivering even more clothing than usual to folks returning to work, traveling to see family, and participating in classes, workshops, and interviews.

Throughout this year and a half, we've thought a lot about what's really important, and one of the consistent themes that emerges is being of service to our community. When you support our work with your contributions of clothing, funding, or your time and talents, you are investing in a strong and resilient community.

This spring, Second Chances was honored to receive a competitive, multi-year grant from the **Cummings Foundation**. This funding will enable us to dream big – creating opportunities to be of more service to our community. We're looking forward to developing and sharing our plans with you over the coming months and years.

We still don't know what the future holds, but we're expecting an increasing need for our services as our community recovers. Community Member Profile: Jonathan Dupcak

Last winter as many of us canceled plans and worked from home, an ambitious high school student, Jonathan Dupcak, planned his Eagle Scout volunteer project – a community clothing drive to benefit both Second Chances and our partners at Cradles to Crayons. Far exceeding his expectations, he collected 3,600 pounds of clothing for Second Chances and 1,100 pounds of

children's clothing for Cradles to Crayons.

Jonathan recently began his senior year in high school. A competitive swimmer with his high school and club teams, he also volunteers at a food pantry in his community. Jonathan is preparing to apply to colleges with the goal of majoring in premed, followed by medical school. During that time, he hopes to train and work or

volunteer as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT).

Jonathan chose Second Chances after researching organizations online and contacting programs to learn more. He felt drawn to working with a local organization that would distribute the donated clothing to people who need it. Jonathan impressed us with his thoughtful planning and consideration. He paid close attention to logistics and asked thorough questions.

Jonathan was surprised to surpass his initial goal of collecting 700 pounds of clothing and had to adjust some of his plans. As part of the project, Jonathan organized a community collection event at a local church parking lot. More than 50 people came to donate there, contributing half the clothing he collected. He had planned for one day of sorting clothing with Scouts from his troop, but instead needed three days of four-hour sessions. Jonathan led his troop through the sorting process, working around winter weather with the clothing piled on tarps in his driveway so volunteers could spread out for COVID-19 safety.




Jonathan told us that the most valuable lesson he learned through this project was how helping people in need can bring together community for a common goal and give us all hope.


