# Volunteer Profile: Rachel Foy, Hillman Homes

For 15 years, Rachel Foy has been an active volunteer with Second Chances, contributing her time, energy, and resources to support our mission. Her volunteer connection with Second Chances began when she was working as a real estate agent in Somerville and Waltham, and decided to organize annual clothing drives to support folks in our shared community. Now, as the owner and broker at Hillman Homes in West Newton, Rachel has deepened her volunteer commitment to Second Chances and brought her team of agents along as well.

Each year, Hillman Homes hosts two clothing drives as part of their business plan - a tradition Rachel has fostered. "It's easy to provide a place for people to donate clothing to help others, and our clients and neighbors truly appreciate that their donations support people in need in our community," Rachel explains. "Second Chances makes it super easy to host a clothing drive - from creating the webpage and posters to publicizing the event via social media to organizing the pickup. For us, it's a great partnership and way to give back." These efforts result in nearly 1,000 pounds of high-quality clothing, shoes, and accessories donated each time Hillman Homes hosts a drive.

Rachel believes, "as essential as it is to nurture and grow my business, it is equally important to give back. I personally enjoy giving to local organizations that focus on positive change." In 2022, Rachel took on an even bigger role, volunteering to chair Second Chances' COVID-delayed 15th anniversary "Spring Refresh" fundraising event. Her leadership helped raise more than \$35,000 to provide clothing, shoes, and accessories to those in need. Additionally, Rachel has been a dedicated advocate, sponsoring our grant applications to the Greater Boston Association of REALTORS® (GBAR) on multiple occasions.

Rachel Foy embodies the community spirit of Second Chances,

and we are deeply grateful for her longstanding commitment to our work and the folks we serve.

# Partner Profile: CASPAR / Bay Cove



Since 2005, CASPAR's Emergency Services Center (ESC) has been a vital partner to Second Chances, serving as a lifeline for homeless men and women in Cambridge. Located between Kendall Square and Cambridgeport, this unique shelter - now a component of Bay Cove Human Services is one of the few in our area that accepts individuals who are actively using drugs and alcohol.

The relationships formed at the ESC often serve as a critical turning point in the lives of shelter quests, helping them move toward improved wellbeing. The compassionate care provided by the ESC staff, like social worker Cora,


